The Federal Republic of Nigeria has received financing from the World Bank toward the cost of the Nigeria Erosion and Watershed Management Project (NEWMAP), and intends to apply part of the proceeds toward payments under the contracts for this contract, the Borrower shall process the payments using the Direct Payment disbursement method, as defined in the World Bank's Disbursement Guidelines for Investment Project Financing.

Qualification Criteria:

To be eligible for the contract, bidders must meet the following criteria:

- a. Have a general experience in Geological survey and drilling of borehole of at least five (5) years.
- b. Have a minimum of One (1) similar contract of at least that have been satisfactorily or substantially at 80% completed as prime contract between January 1, 2015 and the submission deadline. The qualifying contractor must be in works related to the assignment.
- c. Minimum average annual turnover in construction works of at least following amounts in the last Five (5) years:

- d. Provide evidence of firm's corporate registration in Nigeria.
- e. Provide annual audited account for the last five (5) years (2015-2019) to demonstrate the soundness of the bidder financial situation
- f. Have liquidity and/or evidence of access to or availability of confirmed positive credit facilities of not less than:

- e. Have no history of court/arbitral award decisions at least for the past Five (5) years.
- f. Have practical knowledge of drilling high depth above 200m.
- g. Bidders are required to submit an Environmental, Social, Health and Safety (ESHS) Management Strategies and Implementation Plans required to manage the key ESHS risks of the project as outlined in the relevant sections of the tender document. The suitability of the proposed strategies and plans will be assessed as part of the bid evaluation.
- h. Bidders are required to submit an Environmental, Social, Health and Safety (ESHS) Code of Conduct that will apply to their employees and sub-contractors, and details of how it will be enforced.

Bids will be considered per each lot. Bidders may quote for one or more lots, as bids will be evaluated and awarded on a lot-by-lot basis or combination of contracts, whichever results to be most economical to the project. Bids for part of a lot will be considered Non-responsive.

Qualified domestic bidders may not be eligible to receive a margin of preference of % in Bid Evaluation.

Bidding will be conducted through the National Competitive Bidding procedures as specified in the World Bank's Guidelines: Procurement of Goods, Works and Non-Consulting Services under IBRD Loans and IDA Credits & Grants by World Bank Borrowers July 2014 ("Procurement Guidelines"), and is open to all eligible bidders as defined in the Procurement Guidelines. In addition, please refer to paragraphs 1.6 and 1.7 setting forth the World Bank's policy on conflict of interest.
